University Examinations

University Examinations:

One of the major components of our education system is the evaluation of students through examinations. The education process in any discipline of learning ends with examinations. The entire efforts put in by the teachers in teaching and the students or learning is centered on the results. The conduct of examination is one of the most important activities of the university and Malwanchal University is striving hard to make the conduction of examination to be fair, transparent, efficient and reliable.

The examination system at our university exercises all precautions & efforts to make sure that no inadvertent errors occur throughout the entire process of examination right from procurement of question paper to issuing of mark sheets of the exams. Throughout all these processes a high level of confidentiality is maintained.

At the end of the academic year (minimum of 180 working days). Meetings of the Board of Examination (BOE) of respective disciplines are held to discuss about the date sheets, selection the panel of paper setters, moderators, Chief Exam Superintendent Etc. (45-60 days prior to exam).

The BOE of respective disciplines, then submit the list of paper setters to the office of the COE. More names of paper setters are added and a list is prepared & submitted to the Honorable Vice Chancellor who randomly selects the paper setters. Then the template, sample question paper format with the syllabus are mailed to the paper setters. The University adopts robust methods of procuring the Question Paper through offline and online mode from Senior Faculty members from different universities. Every effort is made to ensure the confidentiality of the question papers received from both the Internal and External examiners.

Senior faculty members from respective disciplines are invited for the moderation of the received question papers. A minimum of 5 sets of question paper per subject are moderated, sealed, packed and stored in the strong room. The date sheets of the examinations are dispatched to the respective institutes and also displayed on the university website.

The process of conducting examination at our university is decentralized, the university appoints Chief Examination superintendent, Exam superintendent & two Assistant Exam superintendents along with junior invigilators who play an important role in conduction and supervision of the examination Halls/centers, one invigilator is assigned for every 20 students. All our examination centers are well equipped with 24x7 CCTV's camera surveillance with signal jammers.



The process of conducting examinations is fully automated. Once the date sheet of the examination is announced, the eligible students can fill up their examinations forms as well download their hall tickets through online mode.

On the day of the theory examination the papers are taken out from the strong room in presence of COE, Registrar and a senior faculty member. The Registrar then randomly selects a question paper packet from among multiple sets of question papers packets. The papers are then printed, sealed and dispatched to the examination centre/s.

The sealed question papers packets dispatched from the university are received in examination centers by the Chief exam superintendent who displays the packets to the student and randomly takes signature of 2 student's representative ascertaining the status of the sealed question paper packets. The examination hall is under the direct supervision of Chief exam superintendent, Exam superintendent & two Assistant exams superintendent under whom junior invigilator work to supervise students. The university also appoints team flying squad, to randomly visit and overlook the process of conduct of exam and to prevent malpractice. At the end of the day's examination the answer scripts are sealed at the examination centers and sent to the examination section.

The examination section receives sealed packets containing answer scripts. Then the answers scripts undergo process of shuffling/mixes by the office assistants. The shuffled answer scripts are then folder & stapled and then a second round of mixing of answer scripts are done. The answer scripts are then coded which ensures a fair quality of evaluation. The coded answers script are then sealed back in cloth packets and stored until evaluation.

The papers undergo double evaluation both by the external examiner as well by the internal examiners. To ensure timely declaration of results, the internal examiners are invited to evaluate the answer scripts starting the next day of the theory papers. All evaluation procedure is done under CCTV's installed in the evaluation room. The answer scripts are evaluated by the internal & external examiners under CCTV's coverage.

After the evaluation of answer scripts the papers are decoded and marks entered into the TR. The Data entered in the TR is again cross checked with the internal theory and practical marks to avoid any errors. The final results sheet once obtained is cross verified by 2 senior professors. The final result is dispatched to the respective institutes. During all the examinations a special committee for UFM is constituted at the university headed by COE to look into all the cases of UFM during examination.



EVALUATION-RELATED GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL MECHANISM

Malwanchal University has an organized mechanism for redressal of exam related grievances both at the institution level and also at the university level

GRIEVANCES RELATED TO INTERNAL ASSESSMENTS

The institutes conduct a minimum of three internal assessments to evaluate continuous progress of the students throughout their academic year. After the conduction of the internal assessments the answer scripts are shown to the students, if any student has grievance related either to discrepancy in totaling or if the students feels the marks are not just, he/she contacts the respective faculty member who had evaluated the answer script. The problem is either solved by the faculty or if in doubt, the faculty reports the matter to the Head of the department for better and optimal clarification. The marks are then displayed.

GRIEVANCES RELATED TO UNIVERSITY EXAMINATIONS

After the declaration of the results of the university examinations, if any student feels the marks obtained are not as per his/her expectation, they can apply for revaluation process.

The Students can apply for revaluation through online. The students can apply for apply for revaluation in not more than 2 subjects by paying a prescribed fees within 15 days of declaration of the university results. The applications are then forwarded by the dean through proper channel.

Once the revaluation forms are received at the office of the controller of examinations, the process of revaluation is initiated. The answers scripts are folded coded and are revaluated by 2 external examiners (other than the examiners who had previously evaluated them). The average of marks given by the examiners is taken into consideration. The results are then prepared and dispatched to the respective institutes for display. Throughout the entire process, a complete transparency is followed to ensure a fair evaluation and the process is time bound.

Scheme for Initiating Research (IR)

A faculty member with Ph.D/MD/MS (recruited or initiating research activity) in a niche area at Malwanchal University.

Aim:

- Enable the beginning of research and related activities for the recruited faculty member or who has significant potential to attract external funding.
- To attract high quality faculty in the present scenario.

Grants:

Grant of Rs. 2 Lakhs shall be awarded based on the merit of the idea. The amount should be spent within 24 months after grant. (Based on requirement and progress an additional amount of Rs. 1 Lakh may be considered after a year.)



Criteria:

- Faculty member appointed with Ph.D/MD/MS or faculty member starting research in a niche area.
- The faculty should commit to do research and to seek external funding for R & D projects.

Procedure:

Faculty members should apply for IR grant, to his/her Head of the Department, providing details of the research to be carried out in the prescribed form. Total budget should not exceed the prescribed limit.

Constituents:

- Research plan should describe research that is sustainable and has potential to help community.
- Itemized budget should be consistent with research plan.

Evaluation Process:

The application/proposal will be reviewed by a Research Advisory Committee appointed by Vice Chancellor and headed by Chairperson (RAC). On recommendation of the committee, VC will consider, approve and sanction the fund.

Chairperson (RAC) will play a key role in monitoring the expenditure of funds.

Expenditure:

- The grant can be used to purchase research equipment like software, databases, storage, network equipment and laboratory supplies. But purchasing Desktops, Laptops, printers and peripherals are not allowed. The grant also cannot be used for hiring external consultancy or assistance.
- Record of purchase will be maintained by the respective department and sent to Chairperson (RAC) office whenever required.
- All purchases/expenses should be processed in accordance with finance dept. of Malwanchal University policies and procedures.

Expected Outcomes:

The faculty member is expected to seek external mural funding by the end of this grant and also is expected to enhance the teaching performance. The report submitted as part of this grant will also be used for faculty appraisal.



Formulation of Research Project

All faculty / students are expected to conceptualize and formulate research project, in consultation with their HODs from their respective depts. or either Chairperson (RAC).

The format of preparing a detailed proposal is available with the Research Secretariat of Research Advisory Committee. In brief, the proposal should include or provide:

- Outline the proposed research topics in the context of previous work.
- Highlight about your awareness of current information in the field and area of study.
- Identify the research questions (Objectives) which have not been addressed (suitable gaps in knowledge) and the rational for doing the study.
- Propose a hypothesis which the study would address.
- Identify the research methodology, study design which will help answer the research questions.
- Nature of the data to be collected.
- Discussion on expected outcome and usefulness of information which is expected to emerge.
- Systematic compilation and organization of bibliography of literature on the topic considered for research.
- Source of funding for research. The proposal should be submitted to the Research Secretariat, RAC.

Approval of Research Project by Research Advisory Committee

Research Advisory Committee (RAC) which comprises of highly accomplished

Research experienced faculty from both within and outside Malwanchal University, reviews all the new research proposals.

Research scholar/faculty, makes a detailed presentation of the research proposal with emphasis on rational, objectives, expected outcome and usefulness of study.

Approval from RAC is mandatory prior to start of research work. The approval can be either with or without modification of the proposal. RAC may even reject the proposal and suggest working on some other related project. It may suggest resubmission of the proposal incorporating changes suggested by the Committee. Recommendations of RAC are final and Research Scholar/faculty has to comply with the same.



Meetings of RAC, is to be held depending upon the research proposals available in an academic year. Research scholar/faculty has to submit project proposal to Research Secretariat at least 20 days prior to the meeting.

Approval of Research Project by Ethics Committee

Malwanchal University has ethics committees namely for reviewing Clinical Studies, registered with Drug Controller General of India. The projects necessitating the use of humans for research including clinical trial will have to be cleared by the ethics committee before initiating research work. The composition of the committee is as per the guidelines of regulatory body (CDSCO). The Research Scholar/faculty whose projects have been approved by the RAC will submit research proposal in the desired format (available with Research Secretariat) for the consideration of Ethics Committee. Once again, Research Scholar/faculty will be invited to this meeting. Meetings of Ethics Committee are held 15 to 30 days after the RAC meeting.

Vision of the IQAC

Objectives of the IQAC-

Composition of IQAC-

- Few senior administrative officers

Standard Operating Procedures-

1. The tenure of IQAC will be for a continuous period of 2 years from the date of appointment.
2. The Meeting of the IQAC will be conducted quarterly. The quorum for the meeting shall be two-third of the total number of members. Additional meetings may be held as and when required.
3. Secretary in consultation with the chairperson will decide the agenda and send communication to all members. The date, time, venue and agenda of the meeting will be communicated to the members at least one week in advance.
4. Minutes of the meeting will be sent to the members and uploaded to institutional website also.
5. The agenda, minutes and action taken reports will be documented in hard and soft copy formats.
6. Academic and Administrative audits will be done after completion of the academic year. The Schedule of the audit will be finalized by the Chairperson after discussion with the members during the IQAC meeting. Audit reports will be sent to the departments for corrective action.
7. IQAC will prepare annual calendar of the events to be organized at the university and institutional level.
8. After the first cycle of NAAC accreditation of the university, AQAR will be prepared and discussed during the IQAC meeting. Finalized AQAR will be placed before Council for the approval and the approved AQAR will be submitted to the NAAC.
9. All correspondence to and from IQAC will be through a dedicated e-mail id registrar@malwanchaluniversity.com.

Functions:

1. Assessing the documents furnished by individual institutions and authenticating the same with the supporting documents.
2. Strengthen the education system of the institutions through initiatives, innovation and excellence by conducting annual academic & administrative audits.
3. Standardize academic related mechanisms and SOP's to be followed and introduce accountability at all levels.
4. Assessment and enhancement of teaching- learning & evaluation processes being followed at institutional level.
5. Plan & Promote activities in the form of FDP's, seminars and workshops in order to improve equality education aspect of the university.
6. Development and application of quality benchmarks/parameters for various academic and administrative activities of the University.
7. Facilitating the creation of a learner centric environment conducive for quality education and faculty maturation to adopt the required knowledge and technology for



participatory teaching and learning process.

8. Review of feedback responses from students, parents and other stakeholders on quality related institutional process.
9. Acting as a nodal agency of the University for co-ordinating Quality Related Activities, including adoption and dissemination of good practices.
10. Organization of inter and intra university workshops/ seminars on quality related themes and promotion of quality circles.

- Visits to healthcare delivery centers: PHC, ART Centre, Health and Family welfare training centre, District Health Officer and Public Health Laboratory helps in familiarizing with prevention of diseases, practical insight and actual implementation of National Health programs.
- Visits to solid waste management plant, water purification plant, sewage treatment plant, slum areas to understand the role of environment and importance of its preservation for sustainable growth and development.

Industry visits:

Students visit different government/private industries like Madhya Pradesh State Cooperative Dairy Federation (MPSCDF), BIO CNG Plant, Apollo hospital to get exposed to real working equipments/operations. Thus, bridging the gap of academics and industry.

Community Postings:

Students are posted in rural/urban setups. They do health checkup and maintain family health folders. They learn social, economic, environmental aspects of health and diseases in family setup.

SCHEDULE - 20 - ACCOUNTING POLICIES & NOTES TO ACCOUNTS

The following disclosure of accounting policies is made in pursuance of the recommendation of the Accounting Standard Board of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India on disclosure of Accounting Policies:

(a) Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Fixed Assets are stated at original cost less depreciation. Depreciation on all assets have been provided on Written Down Value in the manner prescribed under Income-Tax Rules, 1962.

(b) Basis of Accounting

- 1 The accounts of the Trust are prepared under the historical cost convention. The Trust follows 'Cash System of Accounting'.⁶
- 2 In the opinion of the Trustees of the Trust, the current assets, loans and advances have a value on realisation at least equal to the amount at which they are stated in the Balance Sheet and that the all the liabilities have been considered.
- 3 In the earlier years, the Trust had given certain advances to Amaltad Educational Welfare society for the object of the society. The same is gradually being returned by the society, the balance as at 31st March 2024 stands at INR 31.71 crores. The same was not considered as application of income under section 11 of the Income Tax Act. 1961.
- 4 Due to various amendments made in the Income Tax Act, 1961 regarding computation of application of Income as contemplated under section 11 of the Income Tax Act, 1961 by Finance Act 2021, w.e.f. 01.04.2022, the management of the society in order to cope with the provisions of the Income tax Act, 1961, has changed the method of accounting of the society and the institutions run by the society from that of mercantile system to cash system. The impact of such change in the method could not be ascertained. However, the effect of the transition on of the method of accounting from Mercantile to Cash has been consolidatedly considered and taken to a seperate account titled as 'Accounting Method Transition Adjustment Account' (AMTAA). Such account shall get adjusted in due course of time as and when balances of outstanding debtors/ creditors/ current liabilities etc. as of 31st March 2024, shall get squared off.
- 5 Figures for the previous year have been regrouped and/or rearranged wherever considered necessary.
- 6 The Trustees of the Trust are of the opinion that no contingent liability would accrue to the Trust.

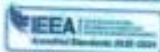

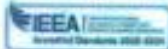
