The Index Institute of Dental Sciences (IIDS), Indore, had organized a comprehensive 3-day value-added course titled "EHTICAL PRACTICE IN DENTISTRY " from JULY 18 to JULY 20, 2024. The course had been a resounding success, featuring notable sessions led by the esteemed expert Dr. Anu Vashisht, M.D.S., who delivered insightful lectures.

The code of ethics teaches all dentists to put their patient first, to involve the patient in treatment decisions and to consider the patient's expectations during treatment planning and maintaining confidentiality of patient. Ethics are critical to being a professional. Without a solid ethical foundation, one cannot be a true professional.

Day 1

The top ten ethical challenges are inadequate sterilization and waste management in dental clinics, poor knowledge and attitude towards ethics among our dental practitioners, in competence among dental professional, increase in cost of oral health service, poor informed consent process, requirement of consensus about the treatment procedures among dentists, Conflict in Advertising, clustering of dental clinics in urban areas, disagreement with treatment modalities among dentist and patient, poor medical record maintenance among our dental practitioners.

The participants were made aware of the DCI CODE OF ETHICS AND DENTIST ACT, 1948 In exercise of the powers conferred by the Dentists Act, 1948 the Dental Council of India as on 2014, issued a copy of the istrar Declaration at the time of the registration. clinical practice, dental records, display of registration number, drugs prescription, fees and other remuneration and signing professional certificates, reports and other documents are provided. Unethical acts related to advertisement, soliciting, publicity and signage, patents and copyrights, rebates and commissions, human rights and unethical practice were discussed.

Ethical practice in dentistry is essential for ensuring high standards of care, patient trust, and professional integrity. It is based on principles such as patient autonomy, beneficence (doing good), non-maleficence (do no harm), justice (fairness), and confidentiality.

Core Principles:

- 1. **Patient Autonomy**: Dentists must ensure patients are informed and voluntarily consent to treatments.
- 2. **Beneficence**: Dentists should always act in the best interest of the patient, promoting their health and well-being.
- 3. **Non-Maleficence**: Dentists must avoid causing harm, ensuring treatments are safe and appropriate.
- 4. **Justice**: Dental care should be provided fairly, without discrimination.
- 5. **Confidentiality**: Patient information must be protected and shared only with consent or as required by law.

Day 2

Common Ethical Dilemmas:

- Over-treatment: Recommending unnecessary procedures for financial gain.
- Informed Consent: Ensuring patients fully understand their treatment options.
- Conflict of Interest: Avoiding decisions influenced by personal or financial incentives.
- Vulnerable Populations: Safeguarding the interests of vulnerable patients.
- End-of-life care: Ethical decisions around treatment continuation in terminal conditions.

Strategies for Upholding Ethics:

Continuous education and training on ethical guidelines.

Building strong, transparent patient-dentist relationships.

Following professional codes of conduct such as those from the ADA.
