Secularism: The Indian Constitution ensures that India remains a secular state, where people of all religions and communities are treated equally.

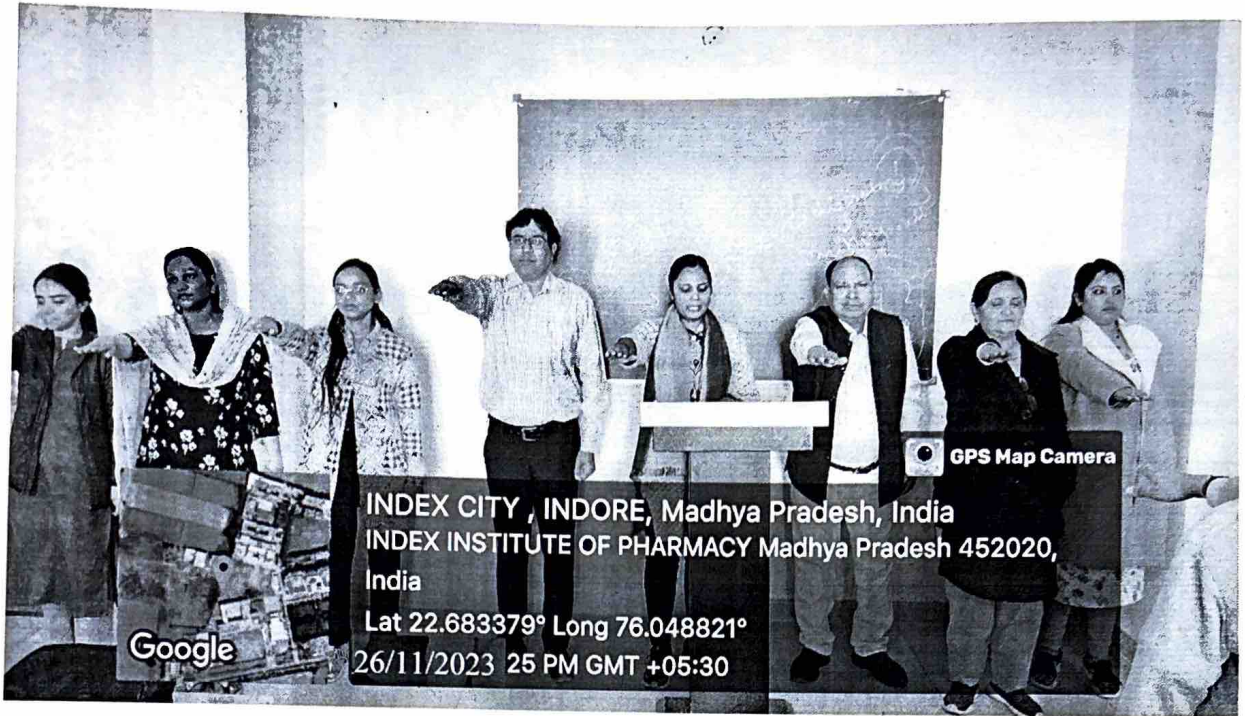
Social Justice: The Constitution advocates for social justice, ensuring the upliftment of marginalized communities such as scheduled castes, scheduled tribes, and other backward classes.

Directive Principles of State Policy: The Constitution lays down guidelines for the government to promote social and economic welfare for all citizens.

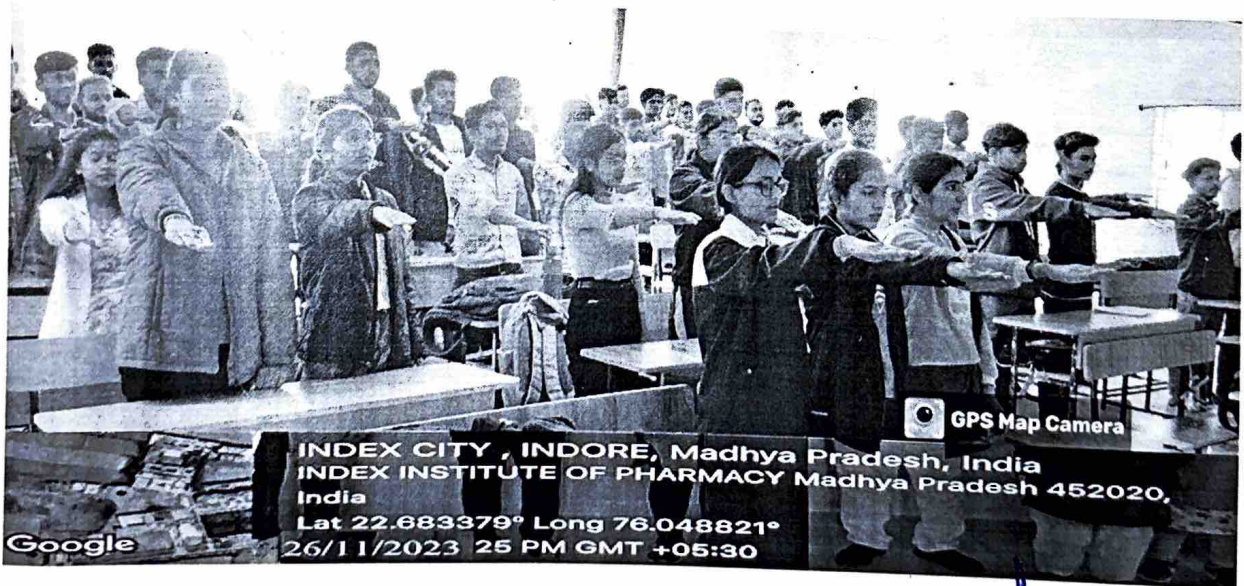
